## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In reviewing the 1984 season, one word describes the overall performance of the Club, that is "Outstanding". On the Administration side, a number of new initiatives were introduced to streamline and run the Club on more business like lines. For the first time ever all Senior fees (Men and Women) were paid in full as a result of a fee discount incentive scheme for early payment plus firm action taken on outstanding fees.

This year, the financial position of the club has improved (see Treasurer's Report) and should alleviate cashflow difficulties prior to the start of the next winter season.

Another new initiative was the framing of individual sub-budgets for each division of the Club - Men, Women and Juniors - within the overall Club budget. This system gave each respective Vice President greater independence and autonomy in the day to day administration of their division, and at the same time provided greater accountability and responsibility.

Some of the more notable on-field performances included:

- \* Super Six Indoor Winners
- \* Moomba Carnival Winners
- \* Neil Snowden (Australian Goalkeeper) our first Club Olympian
- \* SL 1 team being minor premiers and winning for the first time ever the prestigious Pakistan Cup
- \* B Grade Womens team promoted to A Grade
- \* Resurgence of the Juniors as a power
- \* 3 Senior Premierships ( 1 Men and 2 Women ), and
- \* 13 Teams in Finals ( 5 Men, 4 Women, and 4 Juniors ).

Finally, I would like to thank our Sponsors, Members, Supporters and parents, and in particular all committee members who worked long and hard to make this year the most successful in the Club's history.

#### MEN'S REPORT

Once again the men's section of the club has had a very successful year, despite some disappointments. Over the summer both an 'Astro' and 'Twilight' team competed and although neither made the finals an opportunity was provided for many players to maintain an interest in hockey over the "break".

Three teams were entered in the indoor competition with A4 and A2 (just) missing the final but with the super-six side going on to win their third successive premiership in a close final. Finally of course there was Neil Snowden playing both for the Victorian and Australian senior teams.

Much of the success that we have had over the past few years I have attributed to the spirit within each team as well as the enjoyment each individual has had in playing his hockey competitively as well as socially. This is partly due to a tremendous feeling within the club as a whole but much of it stems from the efforts put in by our Captain/Coaches and Team Managers. Already we have entered seven teams for 1985 and will be looking to build even further on our success. In particular we will be aiming at picking up those most elusive flags in State League 1 and Pennant A as well as developing younger members of the club at senior level.

Meanwhile, many senior players are involved in summer competitions and in one of our four indoor teams. Good luck to them all and lets hope we start 1985 like this year with plenty of flags and end it with even more.
