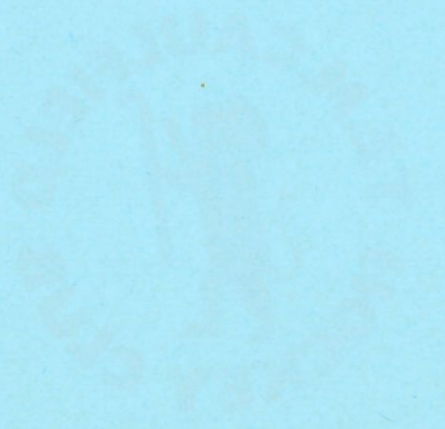

NOTE 1

The accounts have been prepared on a historical cost accrual basis.

NOTE 2

During the 1986/7 year \$2,000 was transferred from Members Equity to the Synthetic Ground Reserve to be specifically set aside for the club's synthetic hockey surface.

NOTE 3

The assets are valued in the following manner:-
Assets acquired prior to 1/11/83 have been valued on the historical cost basis less an allowance for diminution in value to 31/10/84. Fixed assets acquired after 31/10/84 have been valued at historical cost. Depreciation has been provided using the straight line method.

T.E.M.C. fielded nine men's teams in the 1989 winter season:

Overall with seven teams in the finals it can be judged a successful year although we only ended up with one flag to add to the collection.

S.L.1 fielded, at different times, the youngest team for many seasons. Four members of the Premier U17 team played during the year. Kieren Whelan in goals was a brilliant replacement when Lachlan Dreher was playing for Victoria and Australia. Ben Atkins, Ciro Ferrera and Lachlan Fincher all showed they have the ability to play top hockey - it is now up to them to prove they have the dedication.

At the other end of the age spectrum, Bill Hooper showed what commitment can achieve by scoring more field goals this season than any TEMC forward for many years. Cameron King, at 18, won the most improved senior player award and his application reaped a just reward.

S.L.1 had a most frustrating season with injuries and an inability to score goals which cost it a finals place through losses to lower teams. Highlights included Lachlan Dreher's selection in the Australian Team - a fantastic effort. Peter Hough won his twelfth consecutive Best & Fairest from Dale Pearce, Mike Hough and Lachlan Dreher. Fred Ball again contributed a lot with his incomparable managerial skills. Ric Thompson as coach put 100% effort into the job as always, and it was unfortunate that the team's results did not reflect this.

Pennant A and Pennant C had both been promoted from the previous season and faced big tasks in cementing their rise. David Denson as non-playing coach (unintentionally through injury for most of the season) had a diverse group of players to work with. TEMC had 21 players in S.L.1 this year and the number of injuries disrupted cohesion. Nevertheless the younger players will benefit from the experience and kick on.

Pennant C with Gordon Hodges as coach exceeded early predictions by going within a stroke of clinching the Premiership. A very young team in the main supplemented by Veterans Hodges, Pilley and Bartholomews the team had a very successful year.

Metro East with Butch MacPhie at the helm and Ric Thompson at Centre Half very nearly made it through to the Grand Final - missing in the extra time of the Preliminary Final.

South A, playing off in the Grand Final yet again, just went down in extra time.

South B and South D also demonstrated the enormous depth at district level that TEMC possesses.
