The Men's Vic League 1 team has been promoted into Men's Premier League for season 2017. This is the culmination of two years planning and hard work on the part of the players, coaches and committee. I congratulate them all.

In winter season 2016, we had teams from each division, Juniors, Seniors and Masters play in finals. Four of our Men's Senior teams played in finals. The following teams won the flag:

The Women's Premier League team finished in a mid-ladder position, having taken points from teams which played finals.

# **Men's Report**

2016 was another successful year for the Men's section of the Club with four out of six teams making the finals. Of these two made the grand final in Metro Blue and Vic league 1 Reserves with the Reserves team convincing champions. Metro Blue unfortunately could not pull off the big double act for the day, however, with a massive crowd on hand the Club was the ultimate winner.

We added a sixth team this year and reduced the number of double ups as we became a Club of choice.

It was also pleasing that the two teams that missed the finals Pennant A and Pennant C who both struggled last year were very competitive and not for a few close games getting away, Pennant A could have made finals in what is arguably the hardest competition in the State.

The new Metro team provided a pathway for many juniors to join the senior ranks and also some home team rivalry with the local derbies between the Blue and Red teams drawing large crowds. This culminated in an epic Preliminary Final only settled in an extra time shootout.

The year was not without its challenges and no more than leading into the finals after a tough game with KBH a claim of inappropriate conduct was made and upheld at the first hearing. It is times like this that the real culture and backbone of an organisation is tested. It is with a real sense of pride as the Club stood up and took on the injustice of the system, fought and won to have the decision quashed. A special thanks to our president Michael Norbury, who with persistence pulled off what was a fair and just outcome.

Finally, I would like to thank Ian "Klinka" Kleinschmidt for his services to the club as head Men's Coach over the past two years.

lan took over the Men's team in 2015 after a year of struggle in VL1 and lead the group to the big stage where we successfully took out the flag – the Club' first major premiership win in many years. Although we did not emulate that feat this year, making the finals ensured we were in the best position we could be to be asked to be promoted back into Premier League. Ian's knowledge of the game of hockey and in particular his players has made a massive impact on the culture and performance of the senior section of the Club.

#### Men's Vic League 1

TEM entered the Vic League 1 season as reigning premiers and again on the back of an excellent preseason run by John and boys at Melbourne Athletic Development. During the offseason the team unfortunately lost the best & fairest winner Matt Pitcher to Brisbane.

The season started slowly with draws to Geelong and consecutive losses for the first time in over 12 months to Yarra and Casey. The Team responded strongly and only lost once in the following 11 games, including two strong wins, one a backs to the wall performance against West Vic in Ballarat, the other a come from behind victory against then ladder leader Mentone at the player friendly time of 9pm Thursday night in Doncaster.

However, the mid-season absence of key players George Hurley, Braden Pitcher and Will Harty as well as some untimely injuries saw the team struggle in the last third of the season to take 5 points from the next 6 games. Particularly frustrating where draws against PEGS and KBH, which despite domination of much of the play, yielded 1-1 results. A win in either of these games would have secured a finals berth.

In round 22 the equation was simple, win or draw against Brunswick to finish 4th, the boys duly saluted winning 2-0 and earning themselves a date with Casey in the elimination final.

TEM have never beaten Casey in Vic League 1 competition across 2 years and went into the match well prepared but went down early to a drag flick before a late equaliser by Braden Pitcher saw the game destined for a shootout, there was some late drama when a defensive turnover was capitalised on by Casey and the resulting field goal saw the match end 2-1 and elimination from the finals. It was a disappointing way to end the season and all 16 players no doubt felt they had left something on the pitch in that game and during the season.

In truth, the premiership defence never gained significant momentum, the fact that 26 players were used highlighted the disruption caused by injury and absences, and the side never were able to fully cope with being the hunted. The positives on the season were a number of debutants from young guns (Cam McKenzie, Pat Cassidy) and old guns (Andy Mills, Ben Lord), the development of Mitch Eager after being dropped and of course the fantastic effort of the reserves to win a much deserved premiership.

This year's Best and Fairest player and winner of the inaugural Peter Hough Shield is **Even Jewell**.

#### Men's Vic League One Reserves

The year for the reserves started off with a tough and hot preseason, under the guidance of new super coach Andy Haining and fitness guru John Nicolosi the building blocks of the team structures and base level of fitness were established in what was going to be an exceptionally long and tough season.

First half of the year went off without a hitch with most games resulting in a win and sitting second only to Mentone by the mid-year break. The buy-in to the structure and leadership of the team showed as all the boys were a "unit" attacking and defending together.

## **Strategy**

We have a simple three-pronged strategy at TEM aimed at attracting, retaining and developing Juniors of all ages and abilities:

- Develop innovative new programs to attract new players to the Club
- Provide an environment to develop, nurture and retain players of all ages and abilities
- Ensure that we have a strong commitment to senior transition to ensure that players are able to develop into long-term senior players for the Club.

#### Growth

TEM Juniors is continuing to experience a growth in player numbers and we proudly fielded 10 full pitch teams this year. A variety of recruitment activities together with a very high retention rate has led to the increase in numbers. It has enabled us to field teams of 13-14 players in most cases, these numbers are ideal and allow opportunities for players to double up, and absences to be managed appropriately.

Recruitment remains the single most important challenge facing any club and as we move into 2017 we plan to further increase playing numbers through a number of strategies to increase retention and attract new players from the local community.

#### Hook In2 Hockey, school clinics and Hockey at Auburn Road

At TEM we are continuing to challenge the perceived wisdom around recruitment into hockey as a sport. With Hockey Victoria's new league entry criteria, this is becoming ever more important. After several years of successful Hook In2 Hockey and school clinics, we have realized that offering a differentiated entry-level product compared to other local clubs is less important than being able to compete with other sports.

Therefore, we have agreed to merge our recruitment program with that of our ground-share club, Hawthorn Hockey Club. We have established the program under the banner "Auburn Road Hockey", we have already run successful clinics at two local schools and a Term 4 Hook In2 Hockey program has just completed. We believe that this collaboration will benefit the junior programs of both Clubs into the future. Thanks to Victor Romagosa, officials from both Clubs and Hockey Victoria staff for supporting the initiative.

#### **Umpiring**

We were fortunate to have the assistance of Tim Cassidy, a senior player and Level 1 umpire, to help coordinate junior umpire rosters and to umpire coach our beginning and intermediate umpires. Between 15 and 20 junior players, mostly from the U14 age group, volunteered their time to commit to U10 and U12 matches on Saturday mornings, and U8 intraclub matches on Friday afternoons.

#### **Senior Transition**

TEM prides itself on its efforts to transition players of all abilities to senior hockey once they are physically able to stand up to the rigors of the senior game. Across the year, at least 20 Juniors played regularly in senior teams. None of that is possible without the fantastically supportive environment created by the senior teams. We believe this is a key point of difference for TEM as a hockey club. It was particularly impressive to see junior players Kobe Dudley maintain his position in Men's VL1 Reserves and Rachel Graven, Charlotte Kennedy, Annabel Kennedy and Olivia Wood hold their spots in the Women's Premier League squad.

#### **Summer Hockey Activities**

The TEM Junior division has several activities running over the summer season – small group coaching with Victor Romagosa, Flames Summer6s, and indoor hockey competition.

It's very rewarding to see over 150 players sign up to term 4 competition in Summer6s and indoor hockey. Thank you to all the coaches, managers and umpires who have volunteered their time for these activities.

Hockey Victoria for the first time ran Indoor Club Championships for U13, U15 and U18 age groups in addition to indoor competitions. We entered 5 teams and were immensely pleased with the fun had by all players over the intensive weekend competitions.

#### **Junior Teams Overview**

#### **Under 8 Squad**

Victor and his band of coaches worked with a group of 15-20 of our youngest players and some very enjoyable match play sessions were held, with the aim of introducing players to the fun of competitive hockey, and getting them ready for U10 hockey next season.

#### **Under 10**

This year, TEM fielded six U10 teams and over 50 players. Inspired and supported by one of our junior parents, Toni Skaife, we entered into a partnership with Lauriston Girls School to provide after school training sessions at the school with the opportunity to play competitive hockey at the weekends. By the end of the year nearly 20 young girls had joined this program.

As well as a relaxed introduction to competitive hockey, the U10 quarter pitch competition also provided an important opportunity for umpire and coach development.

#### Under 12

U12 continues to be an extremely important age group where players transition from quarter pitch to full pitch competition, and the older more experienced players continue to work hard on developing their basic hockey skills. As the players also learnt how to play as a team, we saw dramatic improvement over the course of the year with the District Leopards and the Girls Shield team making finals.

#### Under 14

With successful retention and recruitment strategies, the U14s were the largest playing cohort in the Club in 2016. For the first time, TEM entered shield and district/pennant teams in both the girls and mixed competitions.

The standout team was girls shield team who backed up their minor premiership with a convincing grand final win over Doncaster. Special thanks to their coach of many years, Margie Conley, who in spite of a move to Queensland saw the team to the flag.

The U14 Mixed Shield team was faced with tough opposition and developed their skills and teamwork through the year pushing all of the finalists close in the later stages of the year. Both district/pennant teams were also competitive through the year and have developed a base of players ready for shield competition in 2017.

#### **Under 16**

The U16 Shield players found themselves playing in a shield competition for the first time in their junior careers, with a huge learning curve in front of them and some quality opposition. With mixed results, every match presented a new challenge for players and coaches alike! # **Men's Masters Report**

## Over 35A

# **Umpires & Officials Report**

Umpiring and officials has become an increasingly important area of operations, due to both the introduction of Premier League Entry Criteria, and the growth of our Men's, Women's and Junior sections leading to an increasing amount of matches requiring Club umpire appointments. There are significant targets that must be met if TEM is to maintain its status as a Premier League club and for these reasons we have to continue to attract, develop and support quality umpires and officials.

Changes introduced in 2016 include

- the creation of a new Umpires and Officials section,
- a separate section on the Club website, <u>www.temhockey.com/umpire</u>
- a dedicated Facebook page for umpires and officials,
- a transparent method of communicating umpiring spots that need filling, and
- greater communication between sections about stepping up to help when required.

We were fortunate to have Tim Cassidy, a young Level 1 umpire working towards Level 1 umpire coaching accreditation who came on board in an umpire coaching role. With Tim's assistance, at the beginning of the season we identified a core group of 15-20 players aged at U14 level who were keen and ready to begin their development as umpires. Of these players, 4 became involved at U8 intraclub, 13 started out at U10/U12, and 10 are now umpiring regularly at U10/U12. This squad also included 2 x U12 and 4 x U16 players, and 5-6 players who are in their first or second year of playing seniors.

U8 intraclub competition is run on Fridays and has proven to be an unexpectedly good environment for learning. This is a small pitch competition and beginner umpires are more prepared to use their voices, develop strong whistle tone and get involved in the games. They also get valuable feedback and enjoyment from working with our youngest players. We have worked closely with the Central Flames clubs and the Zone Umpire Development Officer, Judy Robbins, in getting umpires involved in the U10 quarter pitch competition, as well as the Summer6s program in term 4. U12 umpires are appointed once they have gained confidence and experience at the U10 level. This is important as due to the home and away fixtures for U12s it is not always possible to get an umpire coach to these games and they need to have sufficient ability to manage a game on their own.

Umpires for U14/U16 competitions are usually sourced from players who have left juniors. This is an ideal way for older teenagers to stay in touch with junior competition, and build their skills in preparation for umpiring senior competitions. They tend to be more able to do more than one game a night, and are also free to travel to away games when required. We will not roster a junior player to a game immediately before their own on a Friday night, as their priority should always be on preparing with their team not rushing from one commitment to another.

The process for appointing umpires to senior matches has changed in 2016. The appointments requiring filling are posted on facebook and volunteers sought. If no takers by Thursday, the commitment becomes the responsibility of the team involved. It is no longer the responsibility of any single person to source umpires for matches across the Club. Instead we are developing a collective culture with the aim of helping people to work together to use the various resources available to find an umpire.

In 2017 we will work to refine all of the above processes, and continue to coach those umpires who have started out with the aim of progressing to level 1 accreditation. The identification of aspiring Level 2 umpires will take place during pre-season, and we will utilise all the education opportunities provided by HV.



## **Umpires & Officials Report (cont)**

## Technical bench & Technical Officer Development

In 2016 HV introduced the concept of a Technical Bench at all Premier League and Vic League 1 games.

This included HV appointed Technical Officers to officiate at these matches. The TOs then operated with the assistance of Club appointed trained volunteers acting as Judges.

During the course of the year a number of people have trained as judges and the Club now has four accredited Level 1 Technical Officers which means that we meet the requirements of the Premier League Entry Criteria.

We anticipate that HV will look to extend this concept to an increasing number of grades. A consequent of this is that we will probably have to increase the number of Technical Officers and Judges in the Club in 2017.



# **Social**

The 2016 Social report is one in which we both give great enthusiasm to be writing as this year was without a doubt our most successful social year we have had both determined by attendance and money raised.

There is no denial that TEM remains *the best social club in Victoria* - a claim confirmed by the HV live stream commentators.

Hugh McLaughlin and Braden Pitcher would have been nothing this year without their outstanding social committee members: Anna Clothier, Jacqui Gibbons, Bridgette Allen and Cambo McLaughlin worked tirelessly together to ensure the club maintained its high standard.

A massive thank you must also go to The Hawthorn Hotel (the major social sponsor for 2016). Their brilliant venue and continued generosity made the successes of this year possible.
