President's Report

Seniors

Overall the seniors had a successful season.

This year, TEM fielded six senior women's teams and eight senior men's teams, one more men's team than last year.

The top three women's teams played finals, and women's Pennant F (fifths) won the flag. A wonderful result and a just reward for the hard work, dedication and thought of the women's section.

The men's seconds won the HV Men's Premier League Reserves, the first time in TEM history that TEM has won the men's seconds competition, however styled.

The men's thirds played finals, a great result when you consider that the team only avoided relegation at the start of the season through a technicality.

2019 saw our men's and women's first teams play in Premier League. and our seconds teams play in Premier League Reserve.

Overall, we had eight senior teams, Men's Premier League Reserves, Pennant B, Pennant F, Metro B East, and Women's Premier League, Premier League Reserves, Pennant A and Pennant F play finals, with two teams being premiers: MPLR and WPF.

This is an outstanding effort on the part of many people. My congratulations to you all.

Juniors

The TEM juniors' section has many laudable elements. Our girl's hockey offering is probably the best in Victoria. However, there are gaps in the boy's section.

Four teams qualified for finals with the U16 Mixed Shield, U16 Girls Shield and U12 Girls Pennants finishing runners-up.

The Committee is actively pursuing options to improve our junior offering.

TEM must have vibrant and strong juniors' section in order to remain in Premier League.

I repeat my comments made in last year's annual report:

'The challenges facing TEM is to maintain its Premier League status. Whether we remain in Premier League, which is our aim, will be determined by two elements:

- we must be sufficiently competitive so that we rise up the rankings, and
- we must be well administered.

There are many who believe the Premier League competition is too large and would reduce the number of teams in Premier League. That is not the TEM view.'

Little has changed. There are voices in Victorian hockey who would reduce the size of Premier League. These are not in the ascendancy. However, we must redouble our efforts to rise up the rankings.



Masters

This year TEM fielded five Men's and one Women's masters' teams.

Four of the Men's teams made finals, on was premier, two others played off in the grand final

Facilities

Last year I reported that TEM in conjunction with the Hawthorn Hockey Club was successful in obtaining a Victorian Government 'Pick My Project' grant of some \$200,000.

The 'Pick My Project' grant monies have been applied to renewing the lights on both H1 and H2 with 500 LUX LED lights. This new lights on both grounds were operating from June. Indeed, we played our first ever premier league night games in early June.

The surface on H1 was replaced last summer. The new surface is the best surface which has ever been laid at the Hawthorn Malvern Hockey Centre. We now have the best club grounds in Melbourne.

On ANZAC Day this year, our local federal member announced that we had received a grant of \$500,000 to assist in the redevelopment of the club rooms.

We look forward to working with HMHC and the Hawthorn Hockey Club to develop plans to complete the redevelopment.

The application process for both grants was driven by TEM.

Survey

TEM conducted an extensive survey of members in the third quarter of 2019. About 180 members responded. The results show some consistent themes, areas where TEM does well and areas which need work.

The response to the survey is a matter for the incoming committee.

We introduced changes for the Top Squad this season based on player feedback.

The changes we made included setting clear expectations of the commitment required of Top Squad players for the pre-season, working with Melbourne Athlete Development (MAD) to structure and add variety to the fitness program, provided incentives for players to maximise their availability for games throughout the season, clearly defining the roles of the Leaders and agreeing with junior players that their training would be focused on skills training rather than fitness. The coaching program was planned and focused on implementing key principles and structures.

2019 built on 2018 season

Women's teams

In 2018, TEM had four Women's teams in finals and Pennant C won the grand final. Pennant C were promoted to Pennant B in 2019 and as a result TEM has teams in the top 4 levels of Women's competition (WPL, WPLR, WPA and WPB).

In 2019, TEM again had four Women's teams (60 players) in finals: WPL, WPLR, Pen A and Pen F. The fact that our top 3 teams made finals is a reflection of the depth in the Women's Division and the effort over many years to develop TEM's junior and senior players.

Metro B had a competitive season finishing in 6th place.

<u>Pennant F</u> went from third in 2018 to <u>win the Grand Final</u> this year! This was a reflection on the determination of the team and the cohesiveness of the group. This will see the Pennant F team promoted next year to Pennant E. Congratulations to the Pennant F team!!

Both the Pennant A and Pennant F Grand Finals were at KBH and as with 2018, the support from the entire Club at the Grand Finals (and the finals) was tremendous!

<u>Pennant B</u> having been promoted from Pennant C, were competitive finishing $\frac{7^{\text{th}}}{4^{\text{th}}}$ (though only 1 win from being 4^{th}) and have set themselves up for a strong season next year.

<u>Pennant A</u> – had a great combination of junior players, players in their 20s and very experienced players. Pennant A were 4^{th} in 2018. This year, the team <u>made the Grand Final</u> after winning the Qualifying Final over Hawthorn in shoot outs.

<u>Premier League Reserve</u> – benefitted enormously from the work they had all done in the pre-season and during the season to finish in 7^{th} place and again make finals.

Hawthorn Malvern Hockey Centre (HMHC) Annual Report to TEM Hockey Club

HMHC is a joint operation with the 2 major tenants at the Hockey Centre in Auburn Rd Hawthorn, being the Toorak East Malvern Hockey Club (TEM) and the Hawthorn Hockey Club (HHC). A third sub tenant Carey Baptist Grammar School (Carey) also are a major user of the facilities.

TEMC and HHC each appoint 3 Directors to HMHC, which is tasked with operating the 2 grounds, H-1 and H-2, and the pavilion including the kiosk. HHC is represented on behalf of TEM by Rob MacPhie, Carol Mckenzie and Tony Dudley with HHC representatives Ross Blair-Holt (Chairman rotating), Chris Legge (Treasurer) and Russell Kilroe-Smith.

2019 has probably been the biggest year in the history of HMHC.

As well as our usual Queen's Birthday long weekend Senior Country Championships (SSC), we also hosted the Junior State Championships (JSC) in July and a Sikhs Easter national hockey tournament. This was on top of HHC/TEM training and matches, Carey using the grounds during the day and some Saturdays, plus a number of other clubs and schools with regular bookings.

In Jan/Feb 2019, the ground surface on H-1 was replaced after 9 years. The surface deteriorated badly in 2017/2018. The new surface was installed by TigerTurf for \$300,000. Luckily, the shock pad is estimated to have another 10 years life, saving \$140,000 replacement costs. HMHC is now saving funds to replace the H-2 surface in approximately 5 years' time.

In early 2019, thanks to the members of both TEM and HHC clubs both voting strongly in a Pick My Program grant, HMHC received a State Government Grant of \$200,000 to upgrade the lights to state of the art LED's on both grounds. Always good to have a state election! The total cost was \$280,000 of which HMHC paid \$80,000. Particular thanks to Jon Stebbings who materially assisted through his employer both to source the lights from Europe, and to help install.

The H-1 lights were completed in time for the mid-week premier league game between TEM and HHC June. H-2 shortly after. The output measured by lux is well over 500, which is required for premier league matches. The lights can be dialled down to 300 lux for training (being stronger than the previous lights). We can also have half the ground lit only. Our first electricity invoices have shown a reduction in cost.

HMHC have decided that all matches (Juniors/Seniors/Veterans) are full power. All training is at half power (of around 300 lux.)

Thanks to the Federal Election and Josh Frydenberg our local member in Canberra, HMHC received a grant of \$500,000 towards a Pavilion upgrade. This replaces a lot of sausage sizzles! We hope to renovate during 2020.

HMHC also bought a ride on mower and state of the art leaf collector to reduce ground cleaning time from 5 hours to 1 hour a week each ground. This went well until we had a robbery, and someone stole it. We will replace it (with a hidden GPS installed) preseason 2020.

A special thanks to Linda and Grenville for running the very efficient kiosk, to Harry for grounds maintenance and being the odd job man and Norm Walker for running the bookings program.

Club Members should understand that the HMHC grounds (H-1 and H-2) are probably the most used hockey grounds in Victoria, due to our location and facilities. We have a waiting list of clubs wishing to hire time on our pitches. We are exploring ways to find access to additional grounds to cater for the ever growing number of players of all ages.
